These rubrics have been developed and tested by committees representing many universities and colleges and are considered the gold standard in rubrics. Rubrics included on the site include: inquiry and analysis, critical thinking, creative thinking, written communication, oral communication, reading, quantitative literacy, information literacy, teamwork, problem solving, civic knowledge and engagement—local and global, intercultural knowledge and competence, ethical reasoning, foundations and skills for lifelong learning, global learning, and integrative and applied learning.
